

Coral Creek Landfill Rules and Regulations

The following is just a reminder of the rules and regulations for the different types of waste to the landfill. Please pass this information along to all drivers, crews, or anyone who generates garbage under your company's name. Violations of these rules and regulations can result in refusal of loads, double charges as stated in the account agreement, or in continuous violations, banned from the use of the landfill. There will be NO SMOKING on the landfill property past the scale house. Several drivers have been observed actually smoking while standing on the dumping active face. All loads to the landfill must be secure and tarped. It is 7+ miles to the landfill and keeping the road clean has become a full time job. Let's eliminate waste falling off onto the road. It looks unsightly, and is a safety issue to other drivers, livestock, and wildlife.

MSW: Municipal Solid Waste. Basic house hold garbage should be in bags and tied shut to control litter. Any loads to the landfill need to be secured and any loose material must be tarped to control litter. White goods such as washers and dryers will be off loaded at the metal bin. White goods with refrigerant must be drained of coolant, be stamped, and certified as such by a professional. Failure to observe this policy will result in load refusal.

C&D: Construction and Demolition waste. For the safety of the landfill crew and equipment we ask that all timbers and pipe be cut to lengths of 8'. When compacting, this material breaks and flies up in to the windows of equipment. Last thing we want is an injury, or worse, to an operator. Failure to observe this rule will result in refusal of the load, or double rates may be applied as stated in the account agreement.

E&P: Exploration and Production (Oilfield waste). All materials such as tubing, fiberglass pipe, cable, and polypipe must be cut to lengths no longer than 8'. We are unable to accept pit liners unless they are cleaned. No frak sand. There has been an issue with filter socks in the past. The issue has gotten better, however the rule is NO FILTER SOCKS. We are unable to accept them, as they always exceed the analytical limits for chlorides and NORM tests. Finding filter socks in a load will result in load refusal. Repeat offenders will be banned from using the landfill. This is serious business. Pass this information along to everyone.

Tires: Tires need to be removed from the rims and the rims will be placed in the metal recycling bin if the customer wants us to dispose of them. There is a special rate available for pre cut tires. The rate is half the usual rate, but tires must be quartered.

Contaminated Soil: Contaminated soil is just that: soil. All loads must have required analytical tests completed on the load. I must have a copy of the analytical tests before the load is dumped. This is to be sure that the load passes the state rules on limits on hydrocarbons, chlorides, NORM radiation tests. The tests required are DRO, GRO, RCRA Metals, Chlorides, Rad 226 and 228, Pb 210 and % moisture. There also seems to be a lot of misc. garbage appearing mixed in with the contaminated soil. One load had gloves, buckets, cans, paper trash, and tarps. These loads will be charged as E&P waste and not contaminated soil. \$250/ton vs \$100 for soil. That can get quite expensive.

Tree Branches: larger logs must be cut to 4' to 6'. Please pass this information to all those who generate waste under your company name. Together we can keep the landfill operating safely, cleanly, and legal.
